Having outgrown its Mill Lane accommodation, Cambridge Mathematics has moved to the new Centre for Mathematical Sciences (CMS) in Clarkson Road, to join the Isaac Newton Institute. The CMS comprises a glorious suite of pavilions. It was designed by Edward Cullinan Architects, and was completed in December 2002.

The envy of every University with mathematical aspirations, the CMS was constructed at a cost of around £61 million, approximately half of which was raised through the generosity of the many friends of mathematics including individual benefactors and charitable trusts.

Programme

You are invited to the Centre for Mathematical Sciences on Saturday 22 September for a programme of activities and visits.

The CMS site is home to the two Mathematics Departments (Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics, and Pure Mathematics and Mathematical Statistics), as well as the Isaac Newton Institute and the Betty and Gordon Moore Library. The Newton Institute is a national and international visitor research institute; the Moore Library holds the University's working collections in much of the physical sciences and engineering.

Visitors will be able to view the main pavilions including the Newton Institute and the Moore Library, and there will be a programme of tours, talks, and mathematical exhibitions.

The morning session will begin at 11am, followed by lunch from 12.30pm - 1.30pm, and the afternoon session from 1.30pm - 3.00pm. This timing will allow visitors attending the Alumni Weekend to hear Professor Tom Körner's lecture entitled *Mathematics and Smallpox* at 9.30am, and the Vice-Chancellor's address followed by the main afternoon event in Lady Mitchell Hall at 3.45pm.

The capacity of the CMS is limited, and priority will be given to our supporters and their guests. Among Cambridge alumni, those who studied Mathematics will be given priority. Early booking is advised.
