New cross city bus-link

<u>Universal</u> – a new bus service replacing the Uni4, will start operating from Saturday 23rd July. The bus route will run between Madingley Road Park & Ride and Addenbrooke's Hospital via Cambridge Railway Station, approximately every 15 minutes between 07:00 and 19:30 on Mondays to Fridays. On Saturdays a 20 minute service will operate between Madingley Road Park & Ride and Cambridge Railway Station.
