Helen Mason has been awarded an STFC Public Engagement Fellowship. Her project will capitalise on her diverse range of outreach activities with Sun | trek and Tim Peake's flight on the ISS. The main objective is to inspire students to engage with science activities, with a view to exciting their scientific curiosity through cross-curricular activities (science/art) and fostering a long lasting interest in science. Four professional artists are involved with the project.



As part of a collaborative team from University College London, University of Cambridge, the National Astronomical Observatory of

Japan, Nagoya University, and the Institute of Space and Astronautical Science, Helen has also been awarded the <u>Daiwa Adrian Prize</u> from the Daiwa Anglo-Japanese Foundation; which makes prizes available in recognition of significant scientific collaboration between Japanese and British research teams every three years. Helen has been working closely with the Hinode solar satellite team for the last decade.

Helen has also just been made a UK Space Ambassador, in recognition of her extensive work with schools.

- Hamza Fawzi will be joining the Cantab Capital Institute for Mathematics of Information (CCIMI) as a
 University Lecturer from 1st October 2016. Hamza has recently completed a PhD in the EECS
 department at MIT, following on from an M.S. from UCLA and an undergraduate degree in engineering
 and applied mathematics at Mines ParisTech in France. His research focuses on convex optimization
 and obtaining relaxations for hard nonconvex problems in science and engineering.
- Roman Rafikov will be joining DAMTP as a University Lecturer in Astrophysics from mid-September. His research interests include the formation and dynamics of planetary systems, the structure, stability and dynamics of astrophysical disks, and aspects of high-energy astrophysics.
