# New University housing, available for low cost rent from summer 2017 at Eddington on the North West Cambridge Development

Applications are now open for University and College staff members for the subsidised, low cost rental accommodation in the brand new community in Eddington at the <u>North West Cambridge Development</u>. The first phase of development includes 700 homes for University staff which will be available for occupation from summer 2017 onwards. Additional homes will be delivered by market housing developers and will be available on the open market for purchase from autumn 2017. The University homes will be available to rent to:

- Staff of the University, College and affiliated institutions who work at least 18 hours.
- Staff with more than 12 months remaining on their contract, or who have at least 6/8 months remaining if they originally held a 12 month contract.
- Staff who cannot afford open market rent. This will be judged by an evaluation of household income.
- Priority will be given to those staff new to Cambridge, those from overseas and with no previous connection to Cambridge, although we encourage all staff to apply.

Tenancies will be for 12 months with possible extensions for up to three years. # Invitation to participate in focus groups on gender, progression and promotion at the University of Cambridge

To inform the University's investigation into what influences the gender pay gap, the <u>Gender Equality Steering Group (GESG)</u> are undertaking a series of

focus groups to explore how promotion and progression are experienced and perceived by staff in all job types at the University of Cambridge. Data indicates that an area of concern may be the lack of women in higher graded positions across all staff groups. GESG would like to invite all members (regardless of gender) of Academic, Academic-Related, Assistant and Research staff to a series of focus groups seeking to find out more about their experiences and perspectives of career promotion and progression within the University. For staff in Academic roles we would in particular like to engage with staff who have either not been successful, or chosen not to apply through the Senior Academic Promotion Scheme. Your contribution will help us to identify areas that could be improved, as well as to share examples of good practice. This will be vital in planning for the future with the findings of these focus groups reported back to the GESG in Michaelmas term. The focus groups will be confidential and spaces are limited.
