DPMMS:

Congratulations to *Caucher Birker* who has been selected for the William Hopkins Prize of the Cambridge Philosophical Society given for research and spectacular results over the last three years and in particular for work on the proof of the Borisov-Alexeev-Borisov (BAB) conjecture on the boundedness of Fano varieties.

David Spiegelhalter recently discussed 'coincidences' on the <u>BBC Radio 4 - Seriously...</u> programme (starts at 1m 50s); and the statistical probability of people sharing the same birthday on the <u>BBC Radio 4 - More or less</u> programme (starts at 23m 10s); and he has also <u>published a blog</u> about the recent Starbucks legal case in California, pointing out that the court's misunderstandings of statistics meant that they were requesting a level of evidence that would require a study of 85 billion people to provide.

DAMTP:

The Department were saddened to report the death of *Stephen Hawking* on Wednesday 14th March. His obituary and details on his life's work can be viewed on the <u>Centre for Theoretical Cosmology website</u>, the <u>Faculty website</u> and the <u>University website</u>.

Research led by *Julia Gog* which models the impact of an influenza epidemic on the UK recently featured in the BBC programme: '<u>Contagion! The BBC FOUR Pandemic</u>'. Julia has also recently published the following papers: '<u>A new method for detecting signal regions in ordered sequences of real numbers, and application to viral genomic data</u>', and '<u>Contagion! The BBC Four Pandemic – The model behind the documentary</u>'.

James Munro (PhD student) was recently awarded a SIAM UKIE Prize for his excellent contributed talk, 'The initial dynamics of drop coalescence' at the 60th British Applied Mathematics Colloquium (BAMC2018).
