- Writing workshop Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2018, 2.00pm 4.00pm

These transferable skills training workshops are designed to help you develop your ability to write clearly and engagingly about mathematics and science for non-specialist audiences. The writing skills this course focuses on developing are particularly useful for public engagement, such as writing magazine and newspaper articles, but can also help you when writing other types of material aimed at diverse audiences, such as funding applications. The workshops will be highly interactive, incorporating practical exercises, group discussion, and formative feedback and critique of writing produced. Participants are welcome to book either a single workshop (you can book for either the first writing workshop or the second editing workshop as standalone training sessions) or to attend both the workshops as a full short course.
