
### DAMTP:

The <u>2018 Gruber Prize in Cosmology</u> has been awarded to the Planck satellite team, which includes the DAMTP Centre for Theoretical Cosmology (CTC) scientists *Paul Shellard, James Fergusson* and *Anthony Challinor*. The prize is administered by Yale University and this year will be awarded on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2018 at the General Assembly of the International Astronomical Union, in Vienna. Through its study of the Cosmic

Microwave Background (CMB), the Planck observatory collected data that has provided cosmology with the definitive description of the universe on the largest and smallest scales. High level contributions and leadership of several key Planck papers came from the Cambridge Planck Analysis Centre, an interdisciplinary team at the Kavli Institute for Cosmology, made up of members from the Institute of Astronomy, the Cavendish Astrophysics Group and the DAMTP CTC.

# Green Impact Awards 2017-2018

On Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> June CMS hosted the <u>University's Green Impact Award ceremony</u>. Green Impact is the University's flagship sustainability programme, and the teams who participate in the scheme work hard all year to make their department or College as sustainable as possible. This year, there was a record level of involvement with 29 departmental teams and 13 College teams receiving 47 awards; and the Vice—Chancellor of the University, Professor Stephen Toope presented all of the winners with their awards. Green Impact teams receive awards in the Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum categories depending on the number of sustainability actions they had completed.



This year the CMS Green Impact Team were awarded:

- Gold and Platinum awards.
- The 'Community Action Award', which recognises working in partnership with community groups, developing new projects and taking Green Impact out into the wider community. CMS were awarded this for their efforts in carrying out a range of activities with local groups aiming to improve biodiversity in the local area, e.g. running a 'planting day' involving local residents.

Mick Young (CMS Facilities Manager) also received an 'Environmental Hero' Award, which was awarded for his energy and commitment to Green Impact.
