Being Assertive and Making Yourself Heard

Tuesday 11 June, 9.30am - 11:30 am, Postdoc Centre, Mill Lane

Are you able to ask for the things you need and want? The career of a postdoc researcher is demanding, and it involves forging careful relationships with a variety of figures, from PIs to fellow researchers and peers to postgraduate students. Are you capable of asking for help from others? Do you spread yourself too thin by saying yes to others' requests for support? This course is designed to help you develop an assertive mind-set and to communicate your needs in an honest, clear, and respectful way.

Outcomes:

- Understand the benefits of being assertive and the difference between assertive, aggressive, and passive thinking and behaviour
- Know what assertiveness looks and sounds like
- Develop skills in communicating assertively in day-to-day conversation

Writing a Grant Application with Impact (STEMM)

Wednesday 12 June, 9.30am -12.30pm, Postdoc Centre, Mill Lane

Do you know how to write a successful research grant application? This course is designed for postdocs with little or no experience of getting their research funded. It will explore the current research environment and impact agenda and help you understand how research is funded. You will also experience the process of reviewing applications and gain valuable and timely knowledge about how to get research funded.

Outcomes:

- Learn tips and strategies to help you to get your current & future projects funded
- Understand how proposals are assessed by funders
- Gain experience of reviewing funding applications
- Gain information about translational research funding and support available to post-docs

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GENERAL INFORMATION

Reminder to always apply for University travel insurance

Travel insurance is available through the University's Group Business Travel Insurance Policy for employees and postgraduate students travelling away from the UK to carry out University activities. University activities would include overseas trips to attend University-related meetings and conferences or to carry out research. Most trips will be low risk but you should always check the guidance especially when travelling to certain countries.

Before you travel checklist :

- Inform your Departmental Administrator of your forthcoming trip (students do this already via the application for travel expenses).
- Arrange appropriate accommodation and method of travel.
- Complete the appropriate risk assessment form (Low, Medium, High).
- Obtain University travel insurance as soon as possible after booking your trip (only possible if the risk
 assessment is complete) by following the online registration process. Cancellation cover is only available from the date of taking out the insurance www.insurance.admin.cam.ac.uk/travel-insurance.
- Obtain personal travel insurance for any non-work parts of the stay or activities planned, for example sports activities. If you travel frequently it may be sensible to take out annual cover but note that some insurers exclude cover while you are overseas for work reasons so you still need University travel insurance as well.
- Make sure your contact details (including emergency contacts) are up to date on the University HR system (visit Employee Self Service pages <u>www.hrsystems.admin.cam.ac.uk/systems/systems-overview/employee-self-service-ess</u>).
- While on the trip, report any safety concerns to the department.
- If the trip is medium or high risk arrange to frequently check in with someone in the department while away so that they know you are ok.
