Dear Part III student,

Please find below some further information on what to expect over the next couple of weeks.

Exam results

If you sat the pass/fail exam in the first assessment period, your exam results should be available within a day or two following the final Part III examiners meeting, which will take place on Monday, 29 June 2020. You will be able to see whether you passed by logging in to your CamSIS account, and you will be notified by email once this information is available. The marks on individual papers will be emailed to you (and made available to your Director of Studies) shortly afterwards.

Transcripts

After extensive discussions with the University and within the Faculty, taking into account feedback we have received from students over the past two months, it has been decided that transcripts will be handled as follows.

Your University transcript will show an overall pass/fail for the examination, and a list of the papers you sat for the pass/fail examination. In view of the nature of the examination, it will *not* show the marks you obtained on the individual papers, nor will it show an overall percentage mark for the examination.

Alongside the University transcript you will be provided with a formal Faculty statement which will, in addition to the overall pass/fail classification, show the marks you obtained on each paper as well as an overall percentage mark. It will also contain contextual information on the nature of the examination this year. The Faculty statement will be emailed to you within a couple of days of results being released.

The University has confirmed that the University transcripts of those students who choose to sit the later, standard examination will be updated subsequent to that examination.

Graduation

Graduation is a College matter and all queries concerning graduation should be addressed to your College.

The University has confirmed that the first available graduation date for both MMath and MASt students following the release of the pass/fail examination results is Wednesday, 8 July 2020. Further information about subsequent degree ceremonies is available at https://www.cambridgestudents.cam.ac.uk/your-course/graduation-and-what-next/degree-ceremony-dates.

The University has further stated that graduation will be in absence only this summer. If you wish to graduate in absence at the 8 July congregation you must apply either via the graduation tile on your CamSIS self-service by 5pm on Tuesday, 30 June 2020, or directly to your College by the same deadline if your College does not use the graduation facility of

CamSIS. Please note that you do not have to wait to apply until you have received your examination results.

Students who wish to sit the later, standard examination are reminded that they do not need to delay graduation.
