The examinations are all in the week 8-12 June, about one week later than usual, which allows you a little extra preparation time to help compensate for possible recent disruptions.

Candidates in the UK and a range of time zones to the east will be required to start each paper at noon BST, while candidates in the remaining time zones will be assigned a later start time (more details to follow); our aim is to ensure that all candidates can sit the exams during reasonable hours. Upload and download times for all candidates will be monitored by the University.
